

PROGRAM

About the Certificate Program in Middle Eastern Studies

The Middle East is a complex region that defies simplistic definitions and understandings. Local and international students at the American University in Dubai have demonstrated a keen interest in developing their knowledge of this region and in pursuing their careers here.

In order to help them gain a deeper appreciation of the Middle East and its history, cultures, politics, and social structures, AUD offers a Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies.



Program Mission

The Middle Eastern Studies Certificate is an 18-19 credit-hour program designed to give students an appreciation for and understanding of the region in which they are currently studying and in which many will be pursuing professional careers. It is an opportunity for students to enhance their knowledge of the cultural, historical, and political factors that have shaped the Middle East through time and, to a large extent, explain the profile and texture of the current Middle Eastern landscape.

For Study Abroad students, the certificate program offers the unique opportunity to develop their interest in, and awareness of, Middle Eastern culture by living in a Middle Eastern country while earning credit at an American-accredited university.

PROGRAM GOALS

Program Goals

The Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies program seeks to

- Educate students to such a level that they can function successfully in a contemporary global forum with an understanding of other ethnicities and nationalities, specifically those in the Middle East
- Provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the culture(s) of the Middle East region
- Provide students with the necessary skills to critically analyze current situations/events in the Middle East region, considering both cultural and historical backgrounds
- Provide students with an understanding of the geopolitical role of the region in the context of the current concept of "globalization"

Program Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies, tudents will be able to

- Demonstrate required familiarity with Modern Standard Arabic
- Exhibit a geographic knowledge of the region, including both physical and economic aspects
- · Identify and discuss the historical underpinnings of the region
- Explain the basic tenets of the Islamic faith and the role various religions lay in the societies of the Middle East
- Identify and discuss the various cultures whose presence contributes to nd presents challenges to the cohesiveness of the region
- Identify the various political systems historically and currently practiced in the region
- Identify significant contributions to human culture by civilizations in the region





WHO Should be Interested?

Who should be interested?

The Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies should be of otential interest to all baccalaureate degree candidates.

Students who plan to seek employment in the Middle East will gain a deeper understanding of the region – historical, cultural, and political – which will serve them well, regardless of their chosen profession.

Study Abroad students benefit from the structured study of the Middle East as a means of complementing their experiences gained from living in the region.

The Certificate serves to complement the undergraduate degree programs in which students are enrolled, the result being a broadening of cultural knowledge and sensitivity – both of which play a role in professional endeavors and future success.

Who is eligible?

Students pursuing bachelor's degrees at AUD, attending AUD as visiting students, enrolled in the Study Abroad Program, or attending as exchange students,

or

Students who have already completed a bachelor's degree and are only seeking admissions to the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies program.







What are the requirements?

To qualify for admission to the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies program, students must

- Be in good academic standing at AUD or their primary university of study
- Be pursuing or having pursued or earned a bachelor's degree at an institution accredited by the MOE in the UAE, or by the relevant national or regional institutional accrediting body in the case of international applicants
- Have successfully completed ENGL 102 (Advanced Composition and Research), or its equivalent for students coming from institutions in which English is the language of instruction
- Satisfy the English-language requirements for students coming from institutions in which English is not the language of instruction
- Satisfy all other requirements for admission to AUD
- English Language Requirements: Official TOEFL[®] / Academic IELTS[™] test scores

Note

AUD students should apply for the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies by completing the Interest in Pursuing the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies Form, which is available in the Registrar's Office.

*The number of credit hours depends on the Arabic course that students take. 100- and 200-level Arabic courses are 4 credit hours each. The two 300-level Arabic courses are 3 credit hours each.

Course Sequencing

The recommended course sequence for students pursuing the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies is as follows:

Semester I (Six Credits)

MEST 210 and MEST 310, MEST 323, or MEST 343

Semester II (SIX CREDITS)

Arabic Language Course and MEST Religion Course

Semester III (Six Credits)

MEST Area Studies Course and MEST Humanities/Social Sciences Course

Study Abroad Students who only take courses within the scope of the Certificate may complete the program in one semester by incurring an overload.

Completion Requirements

The Certificate will be awarded upon students' completion of all Certificate requirements.


All courses applied towards the Certificate in Middle Eastern Studies must be completed with a grade of C or above, and students must achieve a minimum 2.0 CGPA for the Certificate.

Students completing the program should request the Certificate from the Registrar's Office.
