

The CCT will become a footprint of your time outside the classroom at AUD. The transferable skills gained from these leadership experiences will serve you well as you prepare for a successful future.

Why do I need a Co-Curricular Transcript?

Your Co-Curricular Transcript will complement your resume and academic transcript and can be submitted to graduate schools and prospective employers. The CCT allows you to represent yourself in a more comprehensive manner and paves your way to your future career.

Who is a Personal Counselor?

The Personal Counselor is a trained professional committed to helping AUD students identify, understand, and develop skills to increase their self-awareness and resolve their personal concerns.



What does the Personal Counselor do?

Offering individual one-to-one Counselling Services to help you:

- improve your well-being
- develop self-awareness
- overcome problems that are holding you back
- address mental health concerns (i.e. anxiety, depression)
- develop better relationships
- explore your academic and career directions
- increase your personal and academic resilience
- heal from traumatic experiences





Who can benefit from seeing the Personal Counselor?

Making a transition to university life is not always easy nor is the experience the same for every student. Students face a variety of challenges which may affect their personal growth, emotional well-being, and their ability to strive. Some of these challenges include, but are not limited to:

- Anxiety
- Depression
- Grief, trauma
- Adjustment and transition
- Lack of self-confidence
- Relationship and family difficulties
- Concentration problems

Any of these issues can prevent students from reaching their full potential. Students may find that their previous methods of handling problems are not working. Counseling help students learn new coping skills that help them handle their challenges in a better way.





What is confidentiality?

Confidentiality is the state of keeping everything private and confidential between the counselor and the student. Counseling is a confidential process where students are encouraged to speak freely and trust that their personal information will remain private. In the rare case that the counselor must speak with a student's family member or Dean of Student Affairs, the student will be notified.

GLOSSARY OF ACADEMIC TERMINOLOGY

The following glossary represents a list of the various terms and definitions that students, faculty, and staff encounter at the American University in Dubai.

Academic Advising

The process between the student and an assigned academic advisor that involves exploring the value of a general education, reviewing the services and policies of the institution, discussing educational and career plans, and making appropriate course selections, mainly before registration.

Academic Appeal

A procedure which allows a student to ask for a review of a decision relating to academic progress, mainly following Academic Suspension, or Dismissal.

Academic Dismissal

The end result of a pattern of multiple semesters (often three in number) of grades below the university's standards for Good Academic Standing (2.0 CGPA).

Academic Standing

The key mechanism by which a student's progress in their program is monitored. At the conclusion of each semester's grade processing, a term and cumulative GPA is calculated for each degree-seeking student. A student's academic standing may be impacted by the term GPA or the cumulative GPA, or both.

Academic Warning

An alert issued to a student after one semester of not meeting the University's cumulative grade point average (GPA), usually a 2.0.

Academic Suspension

An official notification that a student has earned a semester grade-point average of less than 2.00 while on academic probation. It normally lasts for one semester, during which the student is not allowed to register for courses at the University.

Alumni

Any student who has been certified as meeting all degree requirements and has been awarded a degree.

Auditing Courses

The option of taking a course for its knowledge value with no intention of earning credits or grades from the course. Students may audit a course as a degree-seeking student or visiting (non-degree seeking students). There are no credit hours associated with audited courses, and auditing a course does not affect a student's GPA.

Blackboard

A proprietary web-based platform which allows instructors to provide materials, communicate, and support student learning.

Co-requisite

A course which must be taken at the same time as another course.

Course Load

The total number of courses (and consequently credits) a student is taking in a given time period.

Course Overload

Refers to any course taken over and above the standard course load. This is normally a 3rd course in the Summer terms, or a 6th course in regular semesters (Fall/Spring), and always requires the academic advisor and the dean's approval.

Course Section

A unique offering of a particular class, such as ARTS200 A, MATH 101 B. (the letter following the course number is the section number). There can be multiple offerings (sections) of a course each semester, and they are published in the Course Schedule.

Course Waitlist

The process of allowing students to submit a request to be considered for registration in a class that is, at the point of registration, full.

Credit Hour

The amount of credit awarded for successful completion of one contact hour of classroom instruction.

Dean

An administrative head of a School, or set of related academic units.

Dean's Honor List

An academic distinction used to recognize the level of highest scholarship demonstrated by students in a given semester. This is determined by looking at the student's term GPA.

Degree Requirements

The list of courses required for each degree program.

Developmental Studies

Uncredited courses taken to provide an opportunity for students to improve their academic skills in preparation for future coursework, mainly in English and Math. These courses do not count towards the student's degree program, or GPA.

Drop/Add

The first week of the Spring & Fall semesters, and the first three days of the Summer semesters during which students can make changes to their course schedules without attracting any penalties.

English Bridge

Two levels of instructions (098 & 099) that prepare students for entry into an academic degree program by developing the English-language skills of reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of, and limit access to, student educational records.

First Year

An undergraduate student who has completed and earned a total of 29 semester credit hours, or less.

Grade Point Average (GPA)

Weighted average calculation that factors in the number of credits in a course, the letter grade earned, and consequently the quality points for each earned grade according to a pre-determined point system.

Grade Appeal

The process of requesting for a reconsideration of an assigned grade within one month subsequent to the issuance of the grade. Sufficient, tangible evidence must be submitted to support the request for a re-examination of the assigned grade.

Incompletes

Also known as "I" grade. It is temporary grade which may be given at the instructor's discretion to a student when illness, necessary absence, or other reasons beyond the control of the student prevent completion of course requirements by the end of the academic term.

In-Progress (IP)

A grade indicating that a course is still in progress and will be completed at a later date.

Junior

An undergraduate student who has completed and earned a total of 60 to 89 semester credit hours.

Minor

Also known as academic minor. The academic minor comprises a designated group of classes in a discipline that is outside the major field(s). Minors typically consist of a minimum of 18 credit hours and are not required to obtain a degree.

Pre-requisite

A course which must be completed prior taking another course.

Probation

A period of time in which students must improve their academic standing by meeting or making evident progress toward their University eligibility criteria. Often follows after an Academic Warning for in-school students.

Provost

The head of all academic units. The role of a provost includes supervising school deans and academic support units, encouraging and fostering an environment of excellence, continuous improvement, and collaboration within and across these units.

Semester/Term

An academic period made up of 16 weeks during the fall and the spring, and 7 weeks during the summer terms of each Academic Year.

Senior

An undergraduate student who has completed and earned a total of 90 semester credit hours, or more.

Sophomore

An undergraduate student who has completed and earned a total of 30 to 59 semester credit hours.

Syllabus

An outline and summary of topics to be covered in a course. It stipulates courses content, student work and evaluation of that work.

Transcript

Also known as academic transcript. The academic transcript represents the official university record of student's academic history of coursework completed AUD and the grades and associated Grade Point Average received. Also listed on the transcript are declared academic credentials, awarded academic credentials for students who have completed their degree, and university honors awarded by the institution upon the conferral of the degree.

Withdrawal (from Courses)

The action of officially opting out of a class after the Drop/Add period has ended. This attracts no grade penalty, but guarantees no tuition refund. For Fall and Spring terms, the deadline is the end of the 9th week of classes. For Summer I and Summer II, the deadline is the end of the 4th week.

Withdrawal (from the University)

The process of a student officially notifying the Registrar's Office that they no longer wish to be part of the University's student body.


